COUNCIL NEWS

RADF Update

In January 2024, the following RADF applications were approved:

- 2-day Silversmithing Workshop
- 2-day Wyandra Wire & Rust workshop
- Wyandra Youth Photography Workshop

This brings total RADF approvals for 2023-2024 year to ten. All RADF monies have now been expended for 2023-2024. There will be no further funding rounds until after 30th June 2024 when the 2024-2025 funding is announced.

Community groups can appy for The Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF) which is Queensland's largest one-off community grants program and distributes approximately \$60 million each year to not-for-profit community groups.

Disaster Management Funding

Council has been successful in winning \$222,625 of Disaster Management Funding, to fund the Purchase and installation of nine emergency generators to provide emergency backup power to ensure continuous operations of critical services including water, sewerage, fuel supply, and communications.

Council will match this value, extending the investment to \$445,250.

Wyandra Airport

Generous support through the provision of guiding lights for the Wyandra Airport through RFDS fundraising and one of their generous donors Dawn Phillips who chose to help the Wyandra community to ensure they had a safe airstrip for night time emergency landings.

POOL UPDATE

Brenton Benson has resigned as Pool Supervisor and recruitment to the position will commence this week. Council would like to wish Brenton and his family all the best for their future. There was an electrical issue with the safety switch tripping a circuit breaker in the switchboard for the main pool pump last week which caused the pool to be closed for 24 hours. This was beyond Council's control as the switchboard was only replaced within the last 6 months and was not expected to fail. The decision to close the pool is not taken lightly and is done in consultation with a number of people including Council's WHS Officer. Once the pump has not been working for any length of time, the pool is unsafe to swim in until the equipment is running correctly, and the water is balanced in line with the QLD Health Water Quality Guidelines for Public Aquatic Facilities. Council is required to follow these guidelines to ensure that the pool water is appropriately balanced, and this is essential for effective disinfection of the water to ensure that there are no possible contaminants in the water that can cause harm to members of the public. Balanced PH is essential to ensure bather comfort e.g. reduce burning of eyes or irritation of the skin. It is also to ensure protection of Council infrastructure as incorrect pH levels can cause staining of the walls to the pool, dissolves any metal, pitting of concrete, loss of chlorine which means that more chlorine is used, make the pool water cloudy, plugged filters, circulation of pool water is reduced and inefficient sanitisation. If the requirements of the guidelines are not met, Council can be fined under the Public Health Act. Depending on the outage time, it can take up to 24 hours to circulate the water and chemicals fully through the pump and filtration system to achieve full operational capacity.

A number of community members have enquired about the replacement of the shade sails that were damaged during a storm in 2023. We apologise for delay in getting this work completed. There are a number of issues which have impacted on this, and Council is currently working on solutions to get the replacement shade sails installed at the earliest opportunity.

DISASTER DASHBOARD


The Disaster Dashboard is located on the Paroo Shire Council website page https://dashboard.paroo.qld.gov.au/


