Message from the Acting CEO Dave Burges

It certainly has been a trying time since Council's last Community Newsletter with record floods across many parts of the region. Council has been working very hard to respond to this event and our minds are now collectively turning towards the recovery phase. I would like to thank everyone who has contributed in any way over the past weeks to the efforts to protect our communities, their homes and their livelihoods.

Rest assured that Council will put every effort into the recovery phase as we set up a Local Recovery Group to coordinate and make available the many avenues of assistance available from the various levels of government. These recovery activities will kick off in earnest as soon as the river systems to the west of Cunnamulla allow access.

I encourage all affected residents and property owners to visit this website or contact Council for assistance or information.

On other fronts, Council and the organisation have been busy preparing the 2025/26 budget and more information will be available on that soon. Various budget workshops have been held, and more are scheduled over the coming six weeks to ensure Council can deliver the best possible outcomes in the next financial year.

I hope locals and visitors alike got some joy and entertainment from the festivities and that the tourists take up the call to come out to our communities this season to help our economic recovery.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

Paroo Shire Council was successful with a grant application in 2023 under round 1 of the Disaster Ready Fund administered by the Australian Government. The funding was for the purchase, installation and commissioning of back-up power supply generators for a range of bore pumps stations, sewerage pump stations, Council's Works Depot and the Cunnamulla Shire Hall. In total, eleven back-up generators have been provided for the continuation of critical services in times of an emergency.



The total project cost is \$445,250 with 50% of that, being \$222,625, funded by Council. The installation of the generators has been completed in all locations

and final testing and commissioning is underway.

We're thankful that these emergency power provisions weren't required for the recent floods however Council is very aware that planning and investment in critical infrastructure is imperative for our communities in times of need.

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Expressions of Interest are invited from community members to work with Council on a volunteer or casual basis assisting at the Cunnamulla Airport. Duties include assisting with REX flights, refuelling and general airport operations. Training will be provided.
