I assure residents that Council is here to assist and help you recover from this disaster. Please do not hesitate to reach out should any assistance be needed. Regular updates will be provided detailing funding and assistance available from government and agencies alike.

Our annual Outback River Lights Festival went ahead as planned and although I was not able to attend in person from all reports it was another successful event for the Shire. I extend my congratulations to the many locals and visitors who attended. Highlights included the long table dinner held on the Friday night, market stalls, fireworks, lantern parade, music and food vendors.

Last week saw the long-awaited opening of the Yapunyah Lodge Aged Care facility with housing of their first new tenant. Extensive renovations have been undertaken at a cost of around \$400K. Gwandalan Support Services from Dalby are undertaking a long-term lease providing aged care and ancillary NDIS support services. On behalf of Council, we welcome them to our community and look forward to them providing a

much-needed service for the Paroo Shire.

Further budget preparations have been made in the last few weeks with budget costings to be finalised over the coming weeks to enable adoption at the June council meeting.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

Footpath Construction / Widening Works:

Concrete footpath construction / widening works will commence on or about 12th May 2025. The first stages of this project will be in Francis Street and Alice Street and will then continue on into Watson Street and Louise Street.

The works will require the removal of existing paths (in some locations) and excavation of soil to enable new pathways to be constructed.
