In opening my first monthly update as the new CEO, I would like to acknowledge the work and achievements of Mr Neil 'Poly' Polglase, who has acted as Interim CEO over the last twelve months. Neil is passionate about rural Queensland and he has left an indelible mark on the Paroo Shire.

As this is my first newsletter it would be also remiss of me to not thank the Mayor, Councillors, staff, and community members who have made me so welcome. I have to say the warmth of

welcome has matched the heat I have been used to in Far North Queensland and compensated for the cooler starts to the days in Cunnamulla.

I timed my arrival in Cunnamulla just in time for the Roundup, which was an enormous success. Many congratulations to the organising committee, sponsors, volunteers, riders, and the community who attended and made the event so special.

Over the last few weeks I have held a number of meetings with Shepherd, who project manage our major infrastructure program. I am pleased to report that over 80% of road repairs associated with the January 2024 flood event have now been completed, with the remaining 20% to be finalised very shortly. Focus is now well and truly on the March 2025 flood event repairs and the volume of work is significant.

In finishing, how good was it to have Jonathon Thurston in town this month in his role as an ambassador for Get Ready Queensland together with our local emergency services. All the children seemed to have a great time.

Then in more exciting news for the Paroo Shire and neighbouring communities, Brent Mickelberg, Minister for Transport and Main Roads and Sean Dillon, Assistant Minister for Primary Industry Development, Water and Western Queensland travelled to Eulo to announce funding to deliver a replacement bridge over the Paroo River. Planning is well

underway and we hope to see the new bridge in place in time for the 100th anniversary of the current bridge in 2028.

#### **NEW BRIDGE FOR EULO ON THE WAY!**



Exciting news for our region, a brand-new bridge over the Paroo River at Eulo is officially on the way!

Queensland Transport Minister Brent Mickelberg and Assistant Minister Sean Dillon visited the Shire to announce the project, which forms part of \$155 million in betterment works funded by the Albanese and Crisafulli Governments.

The new bridge will replace the existing 1928 structure and is expected to be completed by 2028

at a cost of \$51 million. It will be wider and built to carry two road trains, improving safety and reliability for residents, freight, and essential services.

The project marks a major win for Eulo and neighbouring communities, strengthening local connectivity and ensuring the region remains accessible year-round.
