Paroo Shire Council Local Law No.5 (Parking) 2011 allows Council to supplement the State Government parking laws to make provisions for parking in our shire. This allows Council to be able to manage parking in your local neighbourhood.

All motorists must comply with the parking provisions of state and local government to ensure the safe movement of traffic.

Illegal and unsafe parking on the road and on footpaths can:

- endanger pedestrians by obstructing their path forcing them onto the road.
- reduce the visibility of road users by obscuring the view of vehicles entering and leaving roads and driveways.
- cause damage to the footpath.
- make it hard for emergency services such as fire and ambulance to attend the property.

You also cannot park:

- on a footpath.
- on a road with continuous yellow line.
- in a designated parking space for a time longer than the maximum time indicated on the official sign.
- a vehicle in a manner that it is not wholly within the space.
- a non-authorized vehicle in a loading zone.
- in a disabled parking space without displaying clearly your permit with the number and expiry date visible from the outside of the vehicle.
- on or across a driveway unless it is to pick up or drop off a passenger.

If the Council officer finds your vehicles parked illegally an infringement notice may be issued to the registered vehicle owner.
